Claremont Parks/Playground Improvements - The focus will be on the proposed new playground in the Claremont Memorial Park, the proposed new park in the Geranium development, recreation programming, the additional hours of service at the Claremont Library, and replacing the community service organization signs in Claremont.

Recreation & Parks & Libraries — 10 Year Plan/Seaton Recreation Complex & Library - The focus will be on new parks and the recreation complex in Seaton, the Pickering Heritage & Community Centre, the Library's outreach vehicle service to Seaton and there will also be information provided on about recreation programming and the new recreation & parks 10 year plan.

The City of Pickering is working to design the new **Seaton Recreation Complex & Library**, to help meet both the immediate and future needs of Pickering's growing community. The new facility will be located at the re-aligned Whitevale Road (future Alexander Knox) & Sideline 24 (future Burkholder Drive). The Recreation & Parks Master Plan (2017) recommended the following program amenities for the facility, including:

- 25 metre, 6 lane indoor pool with a separate warm water leisure tank
- Fitness centre with a group fitness studio
- Full-size double gymnasium
- Walking track
- Dedicated youth and seniors' spaces
- Multi-purpose rooms
- Full-service Library branch with cutting-edge technology, robust collections and vibrant spaces
- Opportunity for an arena with ice pads

The final program amenities will be guided by the Recreation & Parks 10 Year Plan that is being completed in 2024.

New Pickering Heritage &

Community Centre

We were pleased to support the staff report for Council's approval of the tender for construction of the new Pickering Heritage & Community Centre (PHCC) at the Special Council meeting on February 5, 2024. Pickering Council approved the tender. Construction at the upper site of the Pickering Museum Village has commenced and the new facility will open to the public in Spring 2026.



PHCC will be located at the Pickering Museum Village (Highway 7 & Sixth Concession Road), in the Hamlet of Greenwood and will serve as a new gateway and entrance to the museum. The facility will be a multi-use space, providing a broad range of services to the community, including recreational programming, library services and cultural programs. The new centre will replace the old Greenwood Community Centre, and will host the Pickering History Room, store artifacts and archives, provide community space and programming and City staff office space. Designed to meet Net-Zero carbon design requirements, this facility will replace ageing buildings with a new energy efficient building that will be accessible on all levels to people living with disabilities.
