Alex Monaghan Support Programs

Alex Monaghan, the son of Karen O'Brien and Mayor Kevin Ashe, sadly died by suicide in 2018 at the age of 27. In honour of Mental Health Awareness Month, The City of Pickering, and the Carion Fenn Foundation with funding from the Mayor's Gala held four informative sessions in November addressing emotional well-being, youth holistic health, self-care, and the challenges of social media, addiction, academic pressure, resilience, finance, sports, and stress management. The focus was on equipping individuals aged 13 to 30 with effective tools for supporting young people. These sessions featured expert speakers and personal stories. These sessions have been well attended and resulted in meaningful discussions.

The first phase of the development at the southeast corner of Highway 7 and Whites Road will consist of three manufacturing plants and a distribution centre, with an overall gross floor area of over 1,000,000 square feet and the creation of 1,000 new jobs, with another 2,000 jobs coming in the second phase. Once full build-out is complete, the business park will be the largest food manufacturing campus at 2.5 million square feet, or 151 acres in the GTA, as well as one of the largest employers in Pickering with its 3,000 new jobs.

FGF Brands is the largest producer of fresh breads, rolls, croissants, fully baked muffins, and sweet goods, in North America, and has become a global leader by replacing low tech equipment with robotics, integrated Al systems, machine learning, and supply chain innovations. Some of its brands include Wonder Bread, D'italiano, Country Harvest, Stonefire, ACE, and Casa Mendosa.

Capital Projects Update

The 2023 capital construction has been very busy with improvements. New Village greens are coming to Seaton, new park equipment and accessible features are underway at Southcott and Valleyview Parks.

Road resurfacing included the following streets in Ward 3, Victoria Street, Dellbrook Avenue, Jomar Avenue, Stonehurst Road, and Linwood Street

New sidewalks have been installed along sections of Altona Road and Finch Avenue. The new sidewalk extends from Altona Road, west to Shadow Place (on the south side). The Altona Road sidewalk from Finch Avenue south to Sparrow Circle (south leg) on the east side.

The Region of Durham is moving forward with the installation of traffic signals at the intersections of both Altona Road and Pine Grove Avenue, and Finch Avenue and


Rosebank Road and are anticipated to be operational in December of this year.

New traffic signals have been installed at the intersection of Alexander Knox Road and Brock Road, and are now operational. Alexander Knox Road is also open and usable between Brock Road west to Peter Matthews Drive.

Some Capital Projects have received budget approval, but are more complex and require agency permits, utility relocations and detailed design. These projects undergoing design and planning include;

- Joseph Street
- Westney Road from Eighth Concession Road, to Ninth Concession Road (Regional Road #5)
- Scarborough/Pickering Townline Road
- The Sixth Concession Road Reconstruction, complete with storm sewer and outfall and the Greenwood Bridge Rehabilitation project (from Greenwood Road west to Highway 7)
- The Whitevale Road Master Drainage Plan Implementation Project is ongoing including road reconstruction through the Hamlet is in final design.

private properties and bringing them into public ownership and uses. In the early 1990's the TRCA, in consultation with the City of Pickering and local community, developed a master plan for Rotary Frenchman's Bay West Park. The City took over the management of this park in 2001. The master plan has undergone several changes since its initial conception, to meet the needs and desires of the residents, while respecting the natural and environmentally sensitive features in the park. Its construction is now complete and the park is open for the use and enjoyment of the residents. Come check out the recent improvements including pedestrian walkways, a picnic area, fishing node, accessible canoe and kayak launch, an all-season washroom facility, and even some public art.



The final consultations and design for a new boardwalk and other public amenities for Beachfront Park and Millennium Square on the East Spit are underway as well, with the first phase of construction anticipated for 2024. Finally, as people often ask, infrastructure work such as utilities are underway for the reconstruction of Sandy Beach Road.
